Youngsters take pride in their trophies

STUDENTS at Priestley

College have impressively raised their game in making the trophies for this year's Warrington Business Awards.

Course tutors Mark Eccleston and Julie Evans say they have been impressed by the creativity, hard work and expertise of their students as they race to put the finishing touches to their masterpieces.
"We're very proud of them,"

says 3D art tutor Julie.

"Some, in particular, have worked so hard and really produced something that we didn't think they had in them.

"They have come up with interesting forms and applied a really professional finish

"Designing and making them for a real client has inspired them to raise the bar.

There have been times when I've been walking around in class and they've said: 'I wouldn't give that to a real person' and gone back to the drawing board when they could have just said: 'Here, mark that'.

"That's because they have pride to do as professional a job as possible because they want a positive reaction when someone picks up their trophy as an award winner."

Priestley College has been

supplying the Warrington Business Awards for several years and the design brief handed to the students by the event organisers has become a key part of their A-level course in product design.

The whole process began in January when they were given a 'blue sky brief'.

"They were given each award category, asked to come up with something desk-top sized, with a strong visual impact and then told 'anything goes'!" says product design tutor Mark.

"It was good because they

could really use their creativity

Danielle Lunn, aged 17, chose the International Business of the Year award because she had strong ideas about how she wanted that trophy to look.

"I went for a moon-shaped design with palm trees to sum up being abroad," she said. "I spray-painted it blue, pink

and purple and gave it a mahogany base.

"Making it was the hardest part, but I'm really pleased. Product design is something I've always enjoyed."

The 20 trophies for the winners and runners-up of the 10 categories will be presented at the awards ceremony on July

FOR office workers paperwork is the bane of their lives, but down on the farm, Tim and Cathy Blackshaw positively welcome it!
That's because the couple

have turned a barn at their dairy farm in Stretton into a gigantic filing cupboard, making money from carefully looking after what most people wish they could toss in the bin.

"All sorts of companies use us," says Tim, the 47-year-old managing director of The File-Room.

"Airlines, solicitors, accountants, hospitals. We have more than 60 customers with about a quarter based in Cheshire and the rest in Merseyside, Manchester and the rest of the north west

"We have grown the business by 100 per cent in the past year and we're looking at increasing our capacity by 30 per cent."
